## 1. Bonorong Wildlife Sanctuary and Richmond township

## 2. takara nipaluna: Aboriginal walking tour

### Walking tour takes 90 minutes

Following the footsteps of the Aboriginal resistance fighters in 1832, this immersive walk retraces their path as they made their way to the old Government House, where they sought to negotiate an end to the Black War. Led by indigenous guides, this tour stands as the only Aboriginal-led experience of its kind in nipaluna/Hobart, making it an essential and transformative journey for all.

Under Nunami Sculthorpe-Green's guidance, this powerful tour not only sheds light on the past but also highlights the ongoing presence and contributions of the palawa people in shaping our city's identity. Don't miss this chance to gain a deeper understanding and appreciation for the rich Aboriginal heritage woven into the fabric of our community.

## 3. Callington Mill Distillery, Oatlands

Callington Mill, lies in Tasmania's picturesque Heartlands. It was built in 1837 for two reasons: to legally grind flour, and to illegally make whisky. After nearly two hundred years, we're proud to return the mill to its original, illicit purpose - now perfectly legal, of course.

Oatlands is one of Tasmania's oldest settlements with over 150 sandstone buildings gracing its streets. The impressive Georgian buildings of the 1800s have found new life and are now home to cosy cafes, antique stores, galleries and boutique accommodation.
