



SmartNet Online Networking Event Report

April 13, 2026 (800 – 930, PDT)

SmartNet: *Sustainability of Marine Ecosystems through Global Knowledge Networks* is a UNDOS-endorsed programme led by two intergovernmental marine science organizations, [ICES](#) in the North Atlantic and [PICES](#) in the North Pacific. Through the coordination of the UNDOS team, SmartNet has been affiliated with multiple [UNDOS-endorsed Projects](#), which share common priority areas, such as the Climate-Ecosystem-Fisheries Nexus, Marine Social Ecological-Systems, and the capacity development of underrepresented communities beyond the ICES/PICES regions. This event was the first time to gather representatives of these partner projects to learn about one another's other's activities and explore possible opportunities for collaboration with SmartNet and among these projects.

Agenda 1: Welcome and introduction of SmartNet, including the roles of ICES & PICES

SmartNet co-chairs opened the event and welcomed the participants. PICES SmartNet co-chair, Steven Bograd, presented a programme summary and provided updates on SmartNet activities from 2025 to 2027. ICES SmartNet co-chair, David Reid, introduced the organizational roles of ICES and its UNDOS-relevant activities. They suggested how SmartNet and the partner projects could most efficiently collaborate by leveraging the existing ICES and ICES organizational frameworks (see [Agenda 5: Opportunities](#)).

Agenda 2: Introduction of [ODCC](#): Ocean Decade International Cooperation Center

The Ocean Decade International Cooperation Center, China (ODCC) was established in 2024 as one of the UN Ocean Decade Implementing Partners. ODCC supports SmartNet implementation under the MOU with PICES. ODCC Executive Director, Zheng Wei, introduced the role and mission of ODCC and updated its activities.

Agenda 3: Presentation of 6 partner projects

Among the 10 UNDOS-endorsed projects associated with SmartNet, representatives of five projects presented their project summaries. The 6th project, Fishing for Litter, had not yet been endorsed by UNDOS at the time of the event, but the team had already communicated with SmartNet and was considered a prospective partner. Agenda 4: Brief introduction of the newly endorsed projects

Agenda 5: Opportunities for collaboration through ICES/PICES frameworks and events

As the meeting had already run for more than two hours, there was little time for questions for each speaker and for discussion among the participants. The SmartNet Co-chairs confirmed that they plan to hold similar events in the future, and encouraged participants to stay connected with SmartNet and one another through the shared resources.

The partner projects can most effectively seek opportunities for collaboration with SmartNet through the ICES and PICES frameworks, particularly through **ICES/PICES Expert Groups**. Both organizations have many expert groups with specific scientific and/or strategic goals, some of which share common scientific areas or societal-ecological themes. Some Expert Groups address cross-cutting issues, such as science communication and the promotion of Early Career Ocean Professionals. Collaboration with these Expert Groups may create synergies and enhance project outcomes. The projects are encouraged to explore Expert Group information on the ICES and PICES websites to identify appropriate counterparts, and, where relevant, ask the respective SmartNet co-chairs to facilitate connections with the specific groups (contact the ICES co-char at David.reid@ices.dk for ICES Expert Groups, and the PICES co-chairs at sbograd@ucsc.edu or sanae.chiba@pices.int)
